All Board members, fire chief, and 6 guests attended the April meeting, where they pledged the flag and approved minutes.

Mike Black covered a lot of financial ground, since he missed the past 2 meetings, but everything balanced and the Board approved the report and bill paying.

Loren reported 2 medical aid calls, 3 traffic accidents, and 1 special service call. Volunteers participated in a total of 63 hours of training,, and Quilt used the Aspen Room 2 days.

Jerry, from the VFA, thanked Mike Igou, Dean Grieb, and Audie Brown for running for Board positions in the upcoming election. Greg Sullivan says the BBQ planning is on track, and everyone should make sure to mark July 18th on calendars and attend. There'll even be train rides for children this year!

Old business began with details on the successful pump test, which OSHA required. Loren is moving on with permits and approvals for the new fuel tank, which is being supported with a \$3,000 grant and \$7,000 from Quilt.

Loren presented a short version of the equipment plan, requested by the Board the previous month. Of importance is a diesel

pickup truck to replace the current gas model, as well as a second engine. No decision was made, but investigation into both items will continue.

New stuff included the May budget meeting and the reminder that Loren's contract is up as of June 30th, when he will hand the department over to a new fire chief.

Parting announcements consisted of announcement of a 6:30 executive meeting in May, preceding the official meeting, to speak with applicants for the fire chief position. Mata is writing a FEMA grant to help fund a generator. Quilt raffle tickets are available for this year's project, with proceeds to go toward funding rescue air bags. Drawing will take place at the October Fall Festival..
