

ROCKY POINT FIRE/EMS BOARD NEWS

Three Board members and Loren attended the July meeting. After dispensing with and solving treasury and minutes matters, Loren submitted the Chief’s report.

Volunteers responded to 2 motor vehicle accidents, both at MP 43, 1 disabled vehicle, and 1 bike accident. There were 2 fires, assist with the Doak Mountain fire (where the new tender was a great help) and 1 structure fire. Unfortunately, the new home could not be saved, but the department prevented fire spread. The emergency engine provided standby service at the air show. Volunteers logged more than 50 hours of training, and Quilt used the Aspen Room about 6 days.

The old water tender is still for sale, with an interested party. Revised 08-09 budget was signed.

New business involved discussion and plans for researching ambulance transfer to Medford, now on a case-by-case basis. The issue of a new engine is now on hold.
