ROCKY POINT FIRE/EMS BOARD NEWS

Three regular Board members, one pro tem, and the fire chief attended the December meeting. After minutes and money matters, the group moved to the fire chief report.

Lots of calls again—15. One medical aid with transport, 9 MVAs with no transport, 4 MVAs with transport, and 1 MVA fatality. Volunteers participated in 44 hours of training. Aspen Room was used 4 days by Quilt, 1 day for town hall meeting, and 1 day for Bunko.

Old business began with an update on the fuel tank, which will cost just under \$12,000. Grant money and Quilt funding will pay for the majority, with about \$1200 remaining for the department to fund. Aspen Room policy update was passed. State Auditing firm was chosen, and Greg is still looking for a new department pickup truck.

New items were about acquisitions. Greg has applied for grant monies from Special Districts for a training mannequin. Quilt approved funds to purchase 2 inflatable air bags for rescue.

No further business meant the Board's work was done for another month and they could adjourn.
