ROCKY POINT FIRE/EMS BOARD NEWS

Four Board members, Fire Chief, and 2 guests attended the November meeting. Treasurer matters and minutes of the previous meeting were quickly covered.

Chief reported 19 calls for the previous month—1 medical aid with air ambulance transport, 4 medical aids with ground transport, 1 gun shot wound with ground transport, 6 fire responses, 3 MVAs with ground transport, 1 illegal outdoor burn, 2 MVAs with no transport, and 1 medical aid with no transport. That’s what I call a busy month! In between all those runs, volunteers worked in 52 hours of training. Aspen Room had 4 days’ use by quilt and 1 for the Fall Festival.

Diana, representing the VFA, offered monies in their account to help buy a replacement Fire Chief’s pickup.

Three items under old business—the pad is poured for the fuel tank, and it’s ordered; Board is still working on details relating to Aspen Room use policy revision; and the Board accepted the conditions from the audit corporation.

New business began with the Fire Chief’s accident, which totaled the pickup, but Greg is fine, thankfully. Insurance money will be used to purchase a replacement, with additional funds coming

from VFA. Board members signed and submitted a letter to USFS, objecting to Four Mile Quarry being designated a motorized play area.

After announcing the fire department Board dinner would be on Dec. 12th, the group adjourned to executive session, where no final decisions were made. Meeting adjourned.
