ROCKY POINT FIRE/EMS BOARD NEWS

Three Board members, a pro tem secretary, and the fire chief attended the April meeting. After opening items, the group approved the minutes and agreed to pay the bills.

Greg reported 3 emergency responses for the month, bringing the yearly calls to 16. Volunteers logged 34 hours of training, with 140 for the year. Aspen Room was used 4 days by quilt and one for Bunko.

The fuel tank should be useable pretty soon, since the county-required kill switch has been installed and the emergency sign ordered. Mike says the 06-07 financial paperwork will be delivered to the auditor next week.

New business kicked off with the announcement that the department received a \$14,000 grant for a generator, with thanks to Mata for helping with the request. Greg is rethinking ambulance transport and has concluded interfacility transfers will be handled on an individual basis. Such transports require a change in policy to reflect the fee for Specialty Care of \$2750. The Budget Committee will meet April 24th.

Final announcements brought news that Greg was able to get a lower fax/phone rate for the department. He's also applied for

a rural assistance grant for \$6700 to buy 5 GPS units.


