ROCKY POINT FIRE/EMS BOARD NEWS

All Board members and the fire chief efficiently handled matters at the March meeting, beginning with approving minutes and paying bills.

Fire Chief Greg reported department response to 5 MVAs, 1 medical aid with transport, for a total of 11 calls for the year. Volunteers logged 42 hours of training for the month, 112 hours for the year. Quilt used the Aspen Room 4 days.

Fuel tank electrical work needs to be inspected, the last hurdle in putting the tank to work. Quilt donated \$7000 toward the fuel tank project.

State audit is still in progress. All signage, lights, and paperwork are done on the chief’s pickup. Chiloquin FD donated a 250 gallon skid pump for the truck, which uses water or foam.

Chad, Greg, & Loren attended a meeting about the Lake of the Woods fire protection issue. Start up is very expensive, and no decision has been made.

New business addressed the SDAO grant Greg submitted. It was denied, but the VFA may fund the \$2000 mannequin requested.
