ROCKY POINT FIRE/EMS BOARD NEWS

All Board members and Chief Sullivan attended the August meeting, where they quickly covered the beginning matters of money and the previous month’s minutes. Mike Black reported that the 2009 audit was completed, and the 06-07 audit should be complete soon.

Greg summarized the previous month’s responses—3 wildfires, 1 MVA with transport, 1 medical with helicopter transport, 1 medical with transport, and 1 medical non transport. Year to date response number is 38, compared to 53 in 2009 at the same point in the years. Volunteers logged 54 hours of training, for a total of 300 hours on the year. Aspen Room was used 4 days by Quilt, and 3 days for the BBQ.

The VFA reported the BBQ brought in between \$9,000 and \$10,000. Greg thanked the entire community for their support and work, without which the event would not be its yearly success.

An RFA grant was awarded and used to purchase 12 fire shelters, 5 GPS units, 16 backpacks, and a foam unit. RFA covers 90% of the costs, with the department being required to provide a 10% match.

Two announcements: 1. About 250 bicyclists will be using the lawn area at the fire hall for a break from their Fort Klamath

to Klamath Falls trek on Aug. 14th. 2. Rocky Point EMS will provide emergency stand by for a High Senior Project at Lake of the Woods.

The Board will hold a closed meeting to interview candidates for fire chief on Aug. 18th. At an Aug. 30th meeting, the Board chose Chad Partington to assume Fire Chief position beginning Sept. 1, 2010.
