## ROCKY POINT FIRE/EMS BOARD NEWS

All Board members and the Fire Chief attended the July meeting, kicking off with minutes approval and agreeing to pay the bills. Greg reported 1 wildland fire, 6 MVAs with transport, 1 medical, and 1 mutual aid, bringing call response to 32 for the year, compared with 37 for last year. Volunteers participated in 54 hours of drill, for a total of 260 this year. Quilt used the Aspen Room 5 days.

Mike will check into details concerning a question from the state auditors about funds received for the engine from a grant. Otherwise, things are looking good on the audit front.

New business began with agreement to approve a contract with the USFS for mutual aid. Greg announced he would like to step down as Fire Chief. He will continue to serve as a volunteer, but he would like to vacate the position within 90 days.

Greg's previous fire department donated 2 hose nozzles, saving our department about \$1,000. Everything is on track for the BBQ, so it should be a great day, once again.
