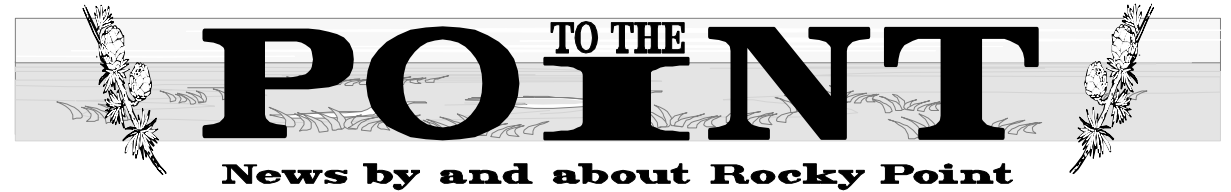

WHAT A BBQ!

In spite of thundershower threats, the throngs turned out for our big July event. The entertaining parade kicked off the festivities, complete with Butch Briery’s band of marry musicians. Of course, people already had a head start on collecting up treasures from the flea market and luscious baked goodies from the bake sale well before that.

Then lines formed for the tri tip, chicken, and hamburgers, prepared this year by Yummy’s Cuisine. And it was yummy, especially when combined with Ted’s famous beans and the other accompaniments.

The day progressed with the very popular beer/wine wagon, soft drinks, bingo, 50/50 sales, vendors, and strategies to be the winning bidder on auction items.

So how did it all shake out? Aside from the great time had by all, the volunteers

outdid themselves on profits. Some highlights include these figures: Flea market busted the old record, with \$500 more than last year; same goes for the bake sale with \$600 past last year’s total; beer/wine doubled profits from 2010; 50/50 kicked in \$400 profit; auction increased the take by more than \$700 over last year; outright donations brought in almost \$950. Grand total came to over \$11,500 which is almost \$2000 more than last year.

The Volunteer Association and lots of community volunteers worked months to have such a successful event. Over 70 people pulled shifts during the day in some capacity or another. Another sector is in large part responsible for our little community’s success, and that’s the donors.

Lots of businesses and individuals donated food or drink, auction items, entertainment and prize goodies, and plain old money. Without them, the continued growth of our volunteer department and contributions to the area’s health and safety would struggle.
