

All Board members, Fire Chief, and one guest attended the July meeting. Routine minutes and money accounting preceded Mike Black’s final financial accounting as Board treasurer. He says everything is on track with the budget for the year. Newly-installed treasurer Terry Roberts requested that the Board allow him to pay bills in a timely manner, and the Board agreed.

Chad reported 1 MVC with transport, 1 medical with transport, bring the year’s total calls to 32.
