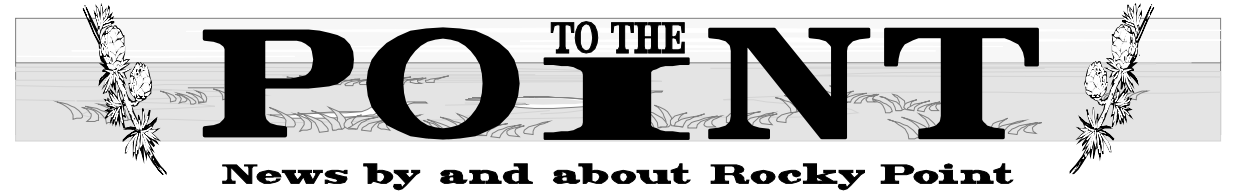

ROCKY POINT FIRE/EMS BOARD

All 5 Board members, Chief Partington, and 3 guests attended the June meeting. Minutes and treasury matters were addressed and approved. Chad reported volunteer responses for the previous month – 1 intercity transport, 2 medical with transport, and 2 fire calls.

Old business consisted of an update on the Disaster Preparedness building. The project is underway, with Jim Rust bringing 2 loads of dirt and Diamond Lumber delivering building materials.

New business began with Terry sharing a Special Districts letter regarding Property Tax Turnover and Investment Pool Authorization, a resolution the Board accepted and approved. The awarded \$10,000 grant will be used to purchase pagers and radios.

Additional discussion served as reminders on important upcoming dates: Cycle Oregon will be Sept. 10th & 11th and Lake of the Woods car show is Sept. 22nd. The Board announced Sherry Harris’s donation of a 5th wheel RV for the BBQ auction.

The business meeting adjourned to hold the final budget approval discussion. Resolutions were approved, as well as the budget with some changes.
