Recently a rumor circulated about county transfer station closures. We asked County Commissioner Dennis Linthicum about the status of that issue, and this is his reply: *"Yes, the County is reviewing the operating losses which stem from our transfer station operations. Currently, we have no definitive plans, specific sites, or possible dates. Yet, nearly all of the County's transfer stations are operating at substantial losses, so we will target the biggest losers first."*
