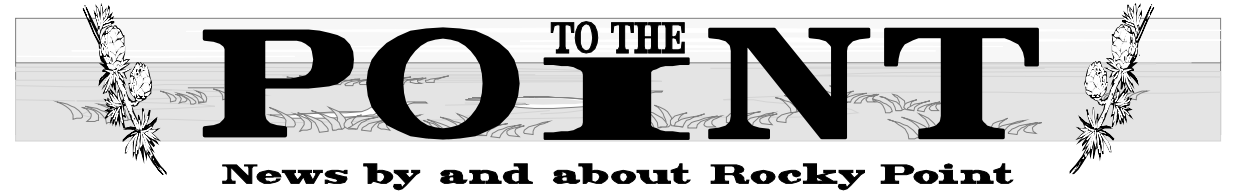

**ROCKY POINT FIRE/EMS BOARD**

Four Board members and 4 guests attended the September meeting, where the minutes and treasurer’s report were approved. Fire Chief Loren said he’d set up the needed engine hose and pump test. Volunteers responded to a few lightening fire calls, as well as a motorcycle accident. He also advised that the department needed a signed hold harmless agreement with the Friday Farmers Market vendors, who use department property. Rita will investigate what’s needed in the document.

Volunteers Mickey Manes and Nick Ryan, and maybe the newly-hired fire chief, will be attending EMT classes. Christy McLaren received Board approval to attend Advanced EMT classes.

Fire District #4 has agreed to provide ALS intercept when requested by our department, depending on staffing. Rocky Point District will pay District #4 50% of the call fee for the service.

The Board approved appointment of Kathy Ross to be chairperson of the 2014 July BBQ, with Rita Donato serving as co-chair and Board representative.

Those in attendance reiterated how critical it is that our department recruit and train more volunteers to meet the special-rate tax and insurance fees. If you can serve, or
