

ROCKY POINT FIRE/EMS BOARD

Four of the 5 Board members attended the June meeting, along with the fire chief and 3 guests. After preliminaries, Fire Chief confirmed that the donated fire engine was now in service. Jerry Aguiar, who facilitated the donation, is working on more equipment donations for our department and thanked the Blacks and community for honoring the new engine with a BBQ. Glenn reported 5 calls last month. He’s met with other agencies to address wildland fire evacuation plans. Christy followed with information on related training and volunteer recruitment.

Fred reported on behalf of the Board that the agreement between the Board and Chief Glenn had been signed for \$1750 per month, with scheduled reviews. Other announcements concerned Fire Med renewals, the upcoming clean-up day, and the president’s role in making motions. New Board member positions are now clarified and a list will be submitted to the County Clerk’s office.

Old business addressed the current fiscal budget and 911 Radio Group.

Community members Helen & Edwin kicked off new business with their proposal for a community garden on fire

department property. Glenn updated the situation with the parking lot repair, there was a reminder on the Rocky Point History upcoming presentation, and Glenn requested help with the September 25th Fire Defense Board Dinner.
